Thursday night, ten Republican presidential candidates took the stage to debate **who hates Planned Parenthood the most.**

They pledged to ban abortion in cases of rape and incest. They promised to defund Planned Parenthood—standing with violent, anti-choice militants with a history of bombing clinics and supporting the murder of doctors.¹

We have a message for anyone who wants to run for president on a platform of defunding Planned Parenthood and gutting abortion rights: Bring. It. On.
