Dear Planned Parenthood Friends,

Sharing Our Stories—it is an important thing to do in our personal lives and within our Planned Parenthood of Greater Iowa (PPGI) family. The many stories we hear each day sometimes make us laugh or sometimes move us to tears. Stories bring back memories and enhance our commitment to our very roots—serving our patients, not the politics, within our state.

What amazing stories we heard and wrote in fiscal year 2007! The new **HPV Vaccine** to prevent cervical cancer was approved by the FDA and is now available to our patients. **Plan B** emergency contraception was approved for over-the-counter sales, greatly increasing accessibility and helping women prevent unintended pregnancy. PPGI's first **Free EC Day** was an incredible success with over one thousand Iowans receiving a complimentary package of Plan B emergency contraception. It was the perfect way to launch our new **Prevention First!** initiative.

December also marked the **successful completion of our 5-year, \$11 million Responsible Choices Capital Campaign**—what a story that was and continues to be! PPGI health centers throughout the state are being updated and modernized and the new **Susan Knapp Health Center** opened in June. **The Elizabeth & David Kruidenier Center for Education & Advocacy**, PPGI's new volunteer center, also became a reality and will house the state's largest library of reproductive health and sexuality education materials as well as provide a setting for advocacy and legislative work.

Good news and progress are also accompanied by new challenges. This year's rules requiring **proof of citizenship for Medicaid patients** caused some women to go without birth control because they could not afford the fifteen dollars for a

copy of their birth certificate. In April, **the U.S. Supreme Court ruled to ban certain abortion procedures**, leaving no exceptions for the woman's health. Although these setbacks may feel like barriers, we are not deterred from our important work!

To you, our supporters and friends, we say **Thank You!** This past year has brought more volunteers to PPGI than ever before and our annual fund and campaign goals have been met and exceeded! **Thank you also to the patients, volunteers and staff who stepped forward to share their stories for this year's Annual Report. They are stories of commitment, dedication, passion and courage. We look forward to hearing your Planned Parenthood story too.**

Patty Taylor,
PPGI PATIENT, RED OAK

My very first visit to Planned Parenthood was in 1973. I was seventeen, a senior in high school—and pregnant! *Roe v. Wade* had just been decided and abortion was only legal in New York and California. My cousin took me to the Des Moines Planned Parenthood and they arranged for my flight to California where a Planned Parenthood van picked me up and took me to the clinic. I was young and frightened but I received warm and professional care even though I was so far away from my small Iowa hometown.

When I returned to Iowa, I began taking birth control pills and for 34 years, no matter where I lived in the state I have remained a loyal Planned Parenthood patient. I almost feel like they are family.

I have no regrets about having an abortion. It might not be right for some women, but it was right for me at the time. I am grateful that Planned Parenthood was there for me and the professional staff made it as painless as possible, both emotionally and physically.

I would like to believe that abortion will continue to be legal in America—and Iowa—and that women will always have the right to make personal decisions about their bodies and their lives.

I'm sharing my story because the TV ads which have been running recently indicate *all* women who have an abortion regret their decision.

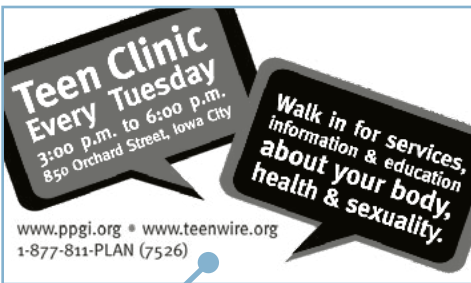
This is not true. My husband and I have four beautiful children, ages five, three, two and one. After our fourth child, my husband had a vasectomy and unfortunately, we were in that small percentage of people who still get pregnant after a permanent sterilization procedure. We already had four special children to love and care for and we were

fearful that we would not have the resources to bring another child into this world and care adequately for that child.

Having an abortion was not an easy decision to make. My husband and I went into the clinic three different times to get information and discuss the options before we chose to end the pregnancy. We were treated with respect and genuine concern each time. The staff gave us lots of information. I received excellent, compassionate care.

I agree that abortion is definitely *not* for everyone, but I think each woman should be able to make her own decision. I hope that other women who are facing an unintended pregnancy are able to receive accurate information and support and not made to feel guilty or have their unique circumstances judged.

- **Vaccine against Cervical Cancer**—PPGI began offering *Gardasil at all 16 health centers*. This is the first vaccine available to prevent cervical cancer and genital warts.
- **Implanon**—PPGI began offering this *new long-term reversible contraceptive* method which works for up to three years by continuously releasing a low dose of a hormone that suppresses ovulation.
- **SurePath Molecular Pap**—PPGI entered a *clinical study* comparing SurePath Molecular Pap to the traditional liquid cytology method. 708 PPGI clients enrolled in this study.
- **Intimate Partner Violence**—PPGI *partnered with the University of Iowa* in a study to estimate the prevalence of Intimate Partner Violence among women seeking elective abortions to ascertain their baseline characteristics, needs and resources.
- **Medication Abortion**—In January, the *Ames Center* implemented medication abortion services to increase access to Story County women and beyond.



- **Teen Clinic**—PPGI opened its first Teen Clinic in *Iowa City*, featuring walk-in appointments and sexuality education for high school students.
- **International Partnerships**—PPGI continued its *intimate partner violence prevention* work with health care personnel in *Samara, Russia*.
- **Adoption Services**—PPGI continued its *successful partnership with the Avalon Center* a licensed adoption agency. 42 women were counseled regarding adoption and four women placed their newborn with adoptive parents.

- **Statewide Partnerships**—PPGI partnered with the University of Iowa's Carver College of Medicine to provide abortion care *rotations for medical students* based at Broadlawns Medical Center in Des Moines.
- **Health Care Outreach**—PPGI provided on-site reproductive health care services to clients in *Woodward and Glenwood* (state resource centers). Services were also provided for residents of *Beacon of Life* (womens' homeless shelter), *Bernie Lorenz Recovery Center* (residential substance abuse treatment program for women), *Family Violence Center* (shelter for women in abusive relationships) and *PROTEUS* (program for migrant farm workers).
- **Smoking Cessation**—Dr. Linda Railsback led PPGI's partnership with the Iowa Department of Public Health Division of Tobacco Control to *initiate smoking cessation* programs for PPGI patients. All PPGI centers also became tobacco free.
- **Civil Rights Award**—PPGI was honored as a 2006 recipient of the Friends of Iowa Civil Rights Award. PPGI was chosen for its work in *improving health care for lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgendered individuals*.
- **Free Emergency Contraception**—Free EC Day was held in December at all PPGI clinics as well as 19 statewide outreach locations, including homeless centers, the YWCA and Homes of Oakridge. More than *1,000 women and men received a free package of Plan B emergency contraception*.

- **Improved Access**—PPGI opened a *new family planning clinic in Knoxville* in November. In June, PPGI's Central Center closed and the *new Susan Knapp Health Center* opened near Drake University in Des Moines.

Activists Stop Pharmacy Rule

In March, the Iowa Pharmacy Board of Examiners proposed a new rule that would allow pharmacists to refuse to fill a prescription based on moral objections. PPGI sprung into action with a Planned Parenthood Action Network (PPAN) e-mail alert which resulted in **438 activists e-mailing the Pharmacy Board**. On March 28, the Iowa Pharmacy Board of Examiners voted unanimously to postpone their decision. **These are some of the personal comments sent by PPGI activists urging the Pharmacy Board to reject the rule:**

"I am a nursing professional and am appalled at the thought that any health care professional would impose their personal moral choices onto a patient. If they are not able to discharge the responsibilities of their job and profession, then they should choose an alternative career—not make a patient suffer."

"For a pharmacist who is simply checking and dispensing what the doctor ordered, to be legally 'ordained' to override both my choice and my doctor's is ludicrous."

"There are so many obstacles placed in the way of women getting the health care they want and are entitled to. A physician or nurse in the emergency room can't refuse to treat a heart attack or emphysema patient because they smoke. A drug addict can't be refused service when he goes to the emergency room. Health care providers' morals should not and cannot interfere with their job duties."

"I feel very strongly that there is a double standard when it comes to Viagra and Plan B, the "morning-after" pill. I don't feel that anyone has the right to make the decision not to fill my prescription because of their religious beliefs. I don't tell them what to believe and it is none of their business how I choose to protect my body and my life. If this was about Viagra, there wouldn't be an issue."

- **Live Action Camp**—In October 2006, volunteers from Iowa City and Des Moines made the trek to South Dakota for a **Live Action Camp with the South Dakota Campaign for Healthy Families**. There, the activists participated in visibility, canvassing and phone banking to help inform South Dakotans about *Referred Law 6*, which would ban all abortions in the state, with no exception for the woman's health, rape or incest. During the general election, *Referred Law 6* was overturned, keeping abortion legal in South Dakota.

- **Lobby Day**—In February, thirty-six PPGL activists marched into the Iowa Statehouse wearing lime green "safety" vests to **promote the Prevention First! Initiative**. The activists participated in more than forty personal meetings with legislators and sent more than one hundred messages by phone and email to their respective house or senate member. The PPGL supporters also met briefly with Governor Culver.

- **Positive Legislation**—During the 2007 legislative session, PPGL's **Prevention First! Initiative** guided long-term legislation goals. *Prevention First!* is being used to educate patients, community members and legislators about the importance of family planning, healthy families and access to birth control. Advocacy efforts resulted in **passage of legislation for research-based and medically accurate sexuality education, access to the HPV (human papilloma virus) vaccine and anti-bullying measures**.

- **Project Pharmacy**—PPGL provided leadership for *Project Pharmacy*, a collaborative effort to assure that Iowa women have information about and **access to emergency contraception (Plan B)**. *Project Pharmacy* researched and identified both friendly and unfriendly pharmacies in regards to access and availability of Plan B and then shared those results through newsletters, MySpace, Facebook and state-wide radio ads.

- **Grassroots Activism**—In the spring, PPGL received a patient inquiry about where to get **Plan B**. Since PPGL clinics were closed at the time, the patient was directed to a local pharmacy. When the patient's boyfriend went into a Des Moines area Walgreens to purchase Plan B, the Walgreens pharmacist informed the young man that Walgreens policy did not allow Plan B to be dispensed to men, speculating that men may misuse Plan B by coercing girls/women to have unprotected sex. PPGL's prompt **advocacy efforts resulted in a formal response and apology from Walgreens**, stating, "the refusal to sell Plan B to male customers is **NOT** in compliance with Walgreens policy." More than 130 PPGL activists then thanked Walgreens for their support.

- **Sexuality Education**—Eight PPGL educators conducted **559 community education programs** reaching **10,512 participants**.

- **Community Events**—PPGL participated in over **40 community events**; assisted in coordinating Free EC Day, World AIDS Day and Teen Pregnancy Prevention Month; and met with dozens of community agencies. During the year, educators spent a total of **1,535 hours providing outreach** to promote PPGL. Below: PPGL Educators at Pride Day.



- **Teen Outreach**—PPGL's **Teen Theater Troupe** held **28 performances** reaching 627 teens.

- **Community Partnerships**—PPGL educators partnered with Webster County social service agencies to provide ongoing sexuality education for the **Webster County Adolescent Pregnancy Prevention program**.

- **Education for "At Risk" Populations**—PPGL educators implemented **Street Smarts and Making Proud Choices** with high-risk youth in shelter care, detention, treatment and alternative school settings.

- **Siouxland Outreach**—Sioux City's Regional Educator educated girls and women at the **Jackson Recovery Centers** (chemical dependency treatment) and provided more than 30 programs for youth of the **Winnebago Tribe**.



- **New Education & Outreach Center**—The **Elizabeth & David Kruidenier Center for Education & Advocacy** opened in June. The Kruidenier Center is open to the public for educational resource materials, trainings and volunteer work.

- **Medical School Course**—PPGL educators taught an **elective class at Des Moines University** focusing on reproductive health, abortion services, sexually transmitted infections and other information vital to medical students.

- **Education on the Web**—In October, PPGL created a profile on **MySpace**, one of the new social networking websites where young persons often receive and share information. (www.MySpace.com/ppgi)

- **Online**—PPGL's website transitioned from a stand-alone website to part of the Planned Parenthood Federation of America's (PPFA) website known as **Planned Parenthood Online**. The new site has let PPGL promote its services, including education programs, in a more user-friendly environment.

Long before the Nike slogan, *Just Do It*, became a part of American pop culture, Mom knew to ***Just Do It!***

As children we watched our activist parents become role models in volunteering. They never uttered the words, “It’s important to volunteer” but we observed Dad attending

Planned Parenthood Board meetings and Mom spending hours on the phone recruiting new volunteers to work at the Planned Parenthood Book Sales. In fact, Mother would confiscate our Roosevelt High School directory and call our friends. It was never, “IF you want to volunteer at the Book Sale,” but rather, “WHEN will you volunteer at the Book Sale!”

Our dad liked to take the money on opening night and Mother loved it all! She keeps coming back after nearly 40 years because she loves the cause and she loves the many “best friends” she’s made through the Book Sale.

Mother marked books every Tuesday and Thursday and sometimes we feared for her safety. One day she was called “baby killer” by a radical protestor nearby. Such an outrageous and frightening comment only strengthened Mother’s resolve to continue her important volunteer work in support of Planned Parenthood.

Mother has chaired the Book Sale twice and one of those times the sale raised almost \$200,000. Several Planned Parenthood Board members told Mother they would like to make a cash gift so they could report that the sale had earned \$200,000. Mother said, “Oh no, you can’t do that. It wouldn’t be right.” That’s mother —always honest and fair!

When Dad passed away we planned his memorial service around the dates of the fall Book Sale—seriously! It made sense that we would have his service then because he always said the Book Sale was “his religion!”

We are both strong Planned Parenthood supporters ourselves now. We believe that if anti-choice people supported the Planned Parenthood mission, they could help make abortion obsolete. Mother and Dad never preached to us about Planned Parenthood, but by osmosis and great role modeling their passion became ours, too!

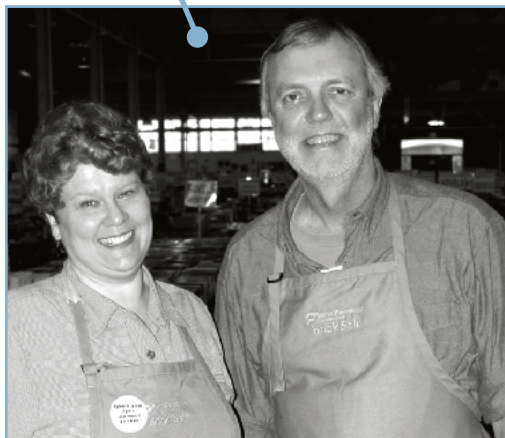
- **Annual Fund**—PPGI donors also generously supported the PPGI Annual Fund, **exceeding the goal of \$1,075,000 by more than \$100,000.**
- **Justice Blackmun Society**—A new donor level was created to encourage strong annual fund support and **recognize supporters who give a gift of \$10,000 or more annually.**

- Freedom Fund Information**—The Freedom Fund *educated 11,393 activists* on issues and the voting records of Iowa state legislators and members of Congress through the annual *Report to Activists* newsletter.
- Staff Increase**—A new position of *Manager of Political Giving* was created in April to raise funds and build statewide awareness to improve the political climate for reproductive health and privacy.
- Community Outreach**—A two year plan for *community outreach* was initiated to build the name and reputation of Freedom Fund in targeted areas of the state.
- Pro-Choice Voter Expansion**—A statewide *voter ID and contact program* was implemented to expand the base of pro-choice voters, volunteers, advocates and donors to help build a pro-choice majority in the Iowa legislature.
- Freedom Fund Website**—a new website was launched to *educate and engage the pro-choice community in electoral work.* (www.FreedomFund.org)

- Increased Donations**—Nearly *\$21,000 was contributed to 40 campaigns* for gubernatorial and statehouse candidates.
- Targeted Districts**—Voter contact and contributions *assisted three senate and two house candidates in targeted districts.* Four of the candidates won: Rich Olive (SD 5), Roger Stewart (SD 13), Staci Appel (SD 37) and Mark Davitt (HD 74). Freedom Fund PAC also supported Susan Radke (HD 10).
- Volunteer Activism**—*Ninety-eight volunteers made 10,127 education and get-out-the-vote phone calls* on behalf of the gubernatorial and targeted statehouse campaigns.
- Primary Endorsement**—In May 2006, PPGI's Freedom Fund PAC awarded its *first ever primary endorsement to gubernatorial candidate/Secretary of State Chet Culver.* Culver has stated numerous times that he won because of his position on Choice and thanked Freedom Fund PAC for supporting him.
- PAC Activities**—The *PAC helped to elect Chet Culver* by utilizing paid television ads, direct mail and phone banks to educate voters on the stakes of the gubernatorial race.

Mary Fox, CENTER MANAGER FOR DES MOINES WEST, KNOXVILLE AND NEWTON CLINICS

In the summer of 1972 I noticed a want ad that shaped my future. The ad said, “Seeking a motivated, self-starting individual who will begin a new family planning clinic in Jasper County.” As they say, “The rest is history!”

Planned Parenthood’s first clinic in Newton was modest to say the least. I started the clinic with a card table and one chair, conducting the monthly clinics at the local hospital because we did not have an exam table or equipment. We weren’t able to stock any contraceptive supplies and all of our patients had to go to the local pharmacy to get their birth control pills.

Even with such humble beginnings, Planned Parenthood and I were a good fit! I became passionate about serving Iowa’s women and helping them prevent unintended pregnancy. Within two years I had a new position to develop Planned Parenthood clinics in rural areas and eagerly accepted the challenge and privilege of opening “satellite” clinics in Creston, Red Oak, Ames and Spirit Lake.

Three decades later I still feel immense pride in this organization and the work I do. During my college years women lived giant secrets. It was not acceptable to be pregnant and unmarried. Immense guilt and genuine fear were associated with unintended pregnancy.

I continue to believe in Warren Buffet’s quote that has been on my home refrigerator for years. It says, ***“If by some magic we could make every child born in this country a wanted child, we would have fewer problems in all areas of society. The closest thing we have to that magic is Planned Parenthood.”*** That quote, and the wonderful people I get to work with each day, keep me motivated and inspired—even after thirty-five years!

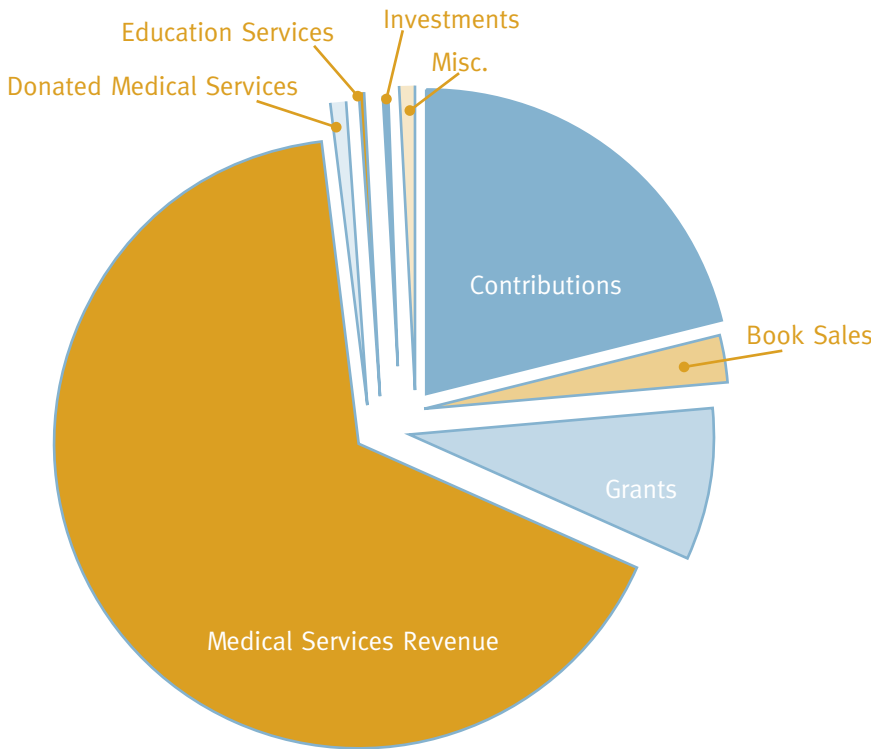

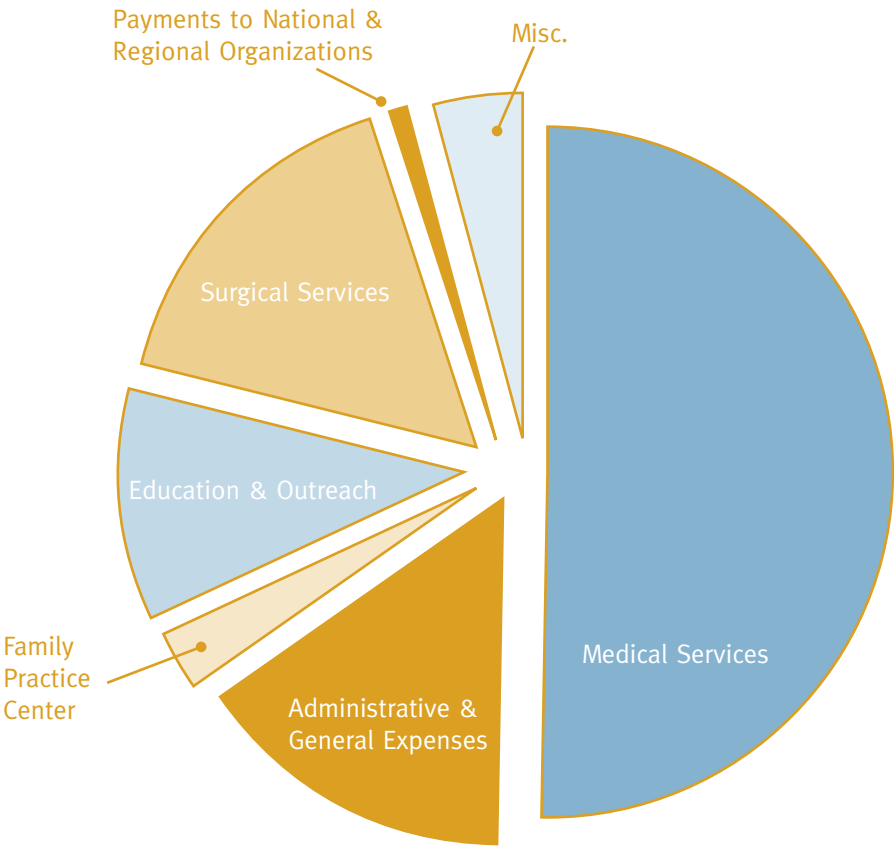

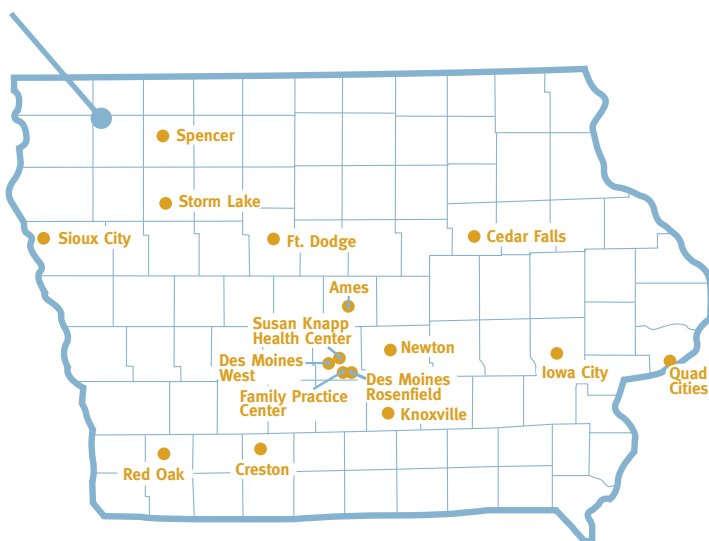

PPGI By the Numbers

- **73 Years**—Planned Parenthood of Greater Iowa has provided women, men and adolescents with education, information and reproductive health services in order to make **responsible choices** about their sexuality and reproduction. - **\$11,019,000**—Amount raised in support of PPGI’s 5 year **Responsible Choices Capital Campaign**.
- **\$5,104,000**—Amount of **Charity Care** PPGI provided for uninsured or underinsured patients. PPGI remains one of the state’s primary “safety net” organizations and provides compassionate, quality care to the **70% of patients who live at 200% of poverty or below**.
- **\$1,196,000**—Amount raised from generous supporters for the 2007 **Annual Fund** to support PPGI’s general operating needs (salaries, rent, utilities, etc.).

Donor Bill of Rights

Philanthropy is based on voluntary action for the common good. It is a tradition of giving and sharing that is primary to the quality of life. To assure that philanthropy merits the respect and trust of the general public, and that donors and prospective donors can have full confidence in the not-for-profit organizations and causes they are asked to support, *we declare that all donors have these rights:*

1. To be informed of the organization's mission, of the way the organization intends to use donated resources and of its capacity to use donations effectively for their intended purposes.
2. To be informed of the identity of those serving on the organization's governing board and to expect the board to exercise prudent judgment in its stewardship responsibilities.
3. To have access to the organization's most recent financial statements.
4. To be assured their gifts will be used for the purposes for which they were given.
5. To receive appropriate acknowledgment and recognition.
6. To be assured that information about their donation is handled with respect and with confidentiality to the extent provided by law.
7. To expect that all relationships with individuals representing organizations of interest to the donor will be professional in nature.
8. To be informed whether those seeking donations are volunteers, employees of the organization or hired solicitors.
9. To have the opportunity for their names to be deleted from mailing lists that an organization may intend to share.
10. To feel free to ask questions when making a donation and to receive prompt, truthful and forthright answers.
